In this hands-on workshop, participants will use hand building and modeling techniques to create realistic or whimsical animal sculptures. Jane will discuss basic anatomy and using gesture to create expression. She will also demonstrate the application of transparent underglazes which she uses like watercolors.

Marjons has a well equipped classroom with banding wheels, water buckets, extruders and slab roller.

Tools to bring: Basic pottery tools plus small wood or silicone tipped modeling tools for detail work, serrated flexible metal rib, small knife, fork, small to medium acrylic paint brush for smoothing. You may also wish to bring reference images printed out or just work from your imagination.

There will be a lunch break so bring snacks and beverages.
