

KATHERYN SINNS WORKSHOP

“Plant-Pots”; combining paper clay with stoneware

SATURDAY MARCH 10TH, FROM 9:00 TO 4:00

WORKSHOP FEE \$95.00

In this workshop, Katheryn will demonstrate her techniques for creating these organic pieces which combine A stoneware vessel with paper clay details. Participants will create their own pieces, using closed forms they either throw on the wheel or create with the press-mold or pinch-pot technique. Glazing techniques will be discussed. We have 9 wheels in the classroom and wheel throwers must be able to throw a 7” cylinder. You don’t have to be an accomplished thrower to participate and all levels of hand building are welcome. All the pieces shown here were first thrown on the potters’ wheel or hand built, then assembled and sculpted with paper clay to create a beautiful finished piece. Each student will complete a finished piece that will be bisque fired, then glazed and fired to cone 5. Clay is included in the workshop fee.

Participants will need to bring the following:

A hair dryer for firming up your projects.

Some wood sculpting tools and wheel throwing tools you are comfortable with.

There will be a lunch break around 12:00 so bring a lunch and beverages.

Marjons has a very well-equipped facility with banding wheels, extruders, and some tools for students to use. For those who may not have a kiln or do not want to transport greenware, Marjons will bisque fire your pieces for the standard firing fee. After they have been glazed, Marjons will fire them to cone 5 for the standard firing fee.
