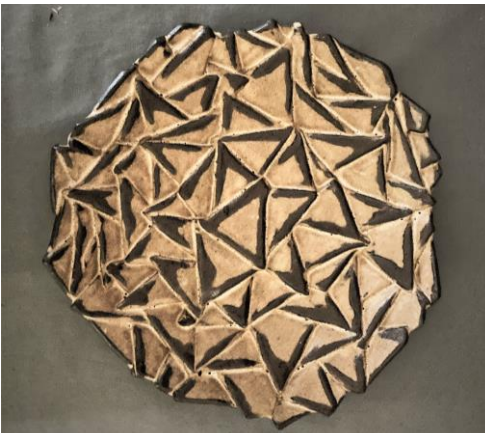

In this 8-hour workshop we will learn how to layout patterns using various shape cutters. All levels of experience welcome, project choice will depend on your skill level. Everyone should be able to complete 2 to 3 pieces, bowls, platters and vases. So the pieces can be completed the project sizes will be about 8 to 10 inches diameter or height.

From 9:00 to 12:00 I will demonstrate several techniques and then start laying out our projects and start assembling them.

There is a one-hour lunch break, then start the finishing stage from 1:00 to 4:00.



The projects are going to very fragile so bring bubble wrap, boxes or suitable materials to transport your pieces. We have plenty of plastic to cover them as they will need to be dried very slowly to prevent cracking. Marjons will fire your pieces if necessary, this will take about 2 weeks to complete the firing process.

What to bring:

Towel, lunch and beverages, clay tools if you have them.
