

# SCULPTING FACES WORKSHOP

In this hands-on workshop, participants will use hand building and sculpture modeling techniques to create expressive human or animal faces. We will explore ways to add character and expression to the faces through additions of clothing and decorative headdresses. Jane will discuss basic anatomy and proportion of the face and surface decoration techniques.

Marjons has a well-equipped classroom with extruders and a slab roller.

Tools to bring: Basic pottery tools plus small modeling tools about 1/4" wide for detail work, serrated flexible metal rib, soft rubber rib, fork and a small to medium acrylic paint brush for smoothing. You may also wish to bring reference images printed out and mixed media materials to plan a headdress.

There will be a lunch break so bring snacks and beverages.
